Students are given an opportunity to experience the realm of careers before entering college.



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### **Mission**

Hopatcong High School students have the chance to learn about potential careers and the responsibilities associated with them. Students must will be matched with an outside or district mentor in the career area they are interested in. All interaction with students and mentors will be outside of the school day on the students' own time outside the school day.

### **Application Process**

Students must submit an Independent Study Application to their Guidance Counselor. The application requires students to submit an essay describing their career interest. Mentors can be in the district or in the community. Counselors, administrators, and staff can assist students with finding local mentors in various careers such as, but not limited to: landscaping design, construction, restaurant ownership, accounting, law offices, auto mechanics, hair salons, nail salons, law enforcement, postal service, emergency services, financial services, photography, music production, etc.

### **Internship Credit & Grading**

Students can earn 2.5 or 5 credits for career internships toward elective credit to fulfill graduation requirements on a Pass/Fail basis. Pass/Fail grades will not be considered for Rank, GPA, and Honor Roll. Additionally, career internships will not count toward the community service graduation requirement for the Class of 2018 and beyond.

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
