 - a) Hopatcong Education Association Scholarship:
 - All seniors may apply.
 - b) Hopatcong High School's PTSO Scholarship:
 - A senior who plans to further pursue his/her education at a 2 or 4 year college or trade school or military. Applicant or family must be an active member of the HHSPTSO. Applicant must have actively participated in community service. See application for additional criteria.
