#### Sussex County Community College (SCCC) - New Concurrent Course List

We have new concurrent courses available through our partnership with SCCC. Concurrent courses are college level courses offered at HHS; students earn high school and college credits simultaneously. Each 3 credit course requires a \$225.00 payment made payable to SCCC. The next opportunity to register for these courses will be for the 2017-2018 school year. (Students enrolled in Culinary Arts 2 for semester 2 may still apply for concurrent credit by January 2017.) Interested students should contact their counselors for more information.

#### **Eligibility Criteria:**

- 1. Must have either earned sufficient SAT scores or Accuplacer scores.
- 2. Must have a minimum 3.0 GPA ("B" average), at the time of scheduling. (\*select courses)
