# College Planning Calendar

# January – March

- Complete college applications and request that transcripts be sent by December 19, so they may be sent out before the winter break.
- Schedule interviews (if applicable) before the new year.
- Take SAT Subject Tests if they are required by any of the colleges to which you are applying if you haven't already. The next test date is January 21, 2017.
- Review the scholarships available in Naviance.
- If you have not already done so, submit the Free Application for Federal Student Financial Aid (FAFSA) online at *www.fafsa.ed.gov* as soon as possible. **The portal to apply opened on October 1, 2016.**
- Check on the status of your admission and financial aid applications as needed through each college's website.
- All juniors and families are invited to attend our evening college planning workshop on January 5<sup>th</sup> at 7pm in the HHS Auditorium. A college admissions representative from Ramapo College of NJ will be the guest speaker.

### **Instant Decision Days**

Sussex County Community College (SCCC) and County College of Morris (CCM) will be conducting their instant decision days at HHS on December 6<sup>th</sup> and December 8<sup>th</sup>, respectively. Students who are interested in attending one of these colleges are encouraged to submit their application(s) and advise their guidance counselor. Any senior who misses these dates, but would still like to apply, should make an appointment to see his/her guidance counselor for directions on how to apply. There is no application fee to apply to SCCC; please see your counselor for assistance. The application fee for CCM is \$30. Students eligible for free/reduced lunch are eligible for an application fee waiver. Please see your counselor as soon as possible for assistance.

# Scheduling

Scheduling for next school year will run during the months of January and February. Counselors will meet with juniors, sophomores and freshmen. Course selection sheets will be sent home for parents to review and sign. Please discuss the chosen courses with your child before you sign and return the form, as this will be your child's schedule for next year.

# **ASVAB**

Any student interested in the military, or who is unsure about a career path, can register for the ASVAB. This test is being offered at HHS on Friday, January 13, 2017. The ASVAB Career Exploration Program can help you take steps now toward finding a career that's right for you. The program is designed to help you learn more about yourself, and to help you explore occupations in line with your career interests and skills. If you are interested, please sign up in the guidance office to register for the ASVAB. *It's free!* Some seniors have been automatically enrolled for this test as a result of receiving partially proficient scores on the spring 2016 PARCC assessments. # PSAT/SAT

PSAT scores will be distributed in **January** for the students who took the PSAT in October. Counselors will help students assess particular strengths and weaknesses, and offer suggestions to help them improve their scores. # PARCC Update

Presently, according to the New Jersey Department of Education, successful completion of the PARCC assessment will be a graduation requirement for the class of 2020. However, all students currently enrolled in high school will need to demonstrate proficiency with regard to Common Core standards as outlined in our curricula. Students may demonstrate proficiency by meeting state guidelines for successful PARCC completion or by a variety of other means outlined in the table below. Students MUST meet *one* of the criteria in the chart for ELA and *one for* Mathematics at some point between grades 9-11 in order to earn a New Jersey high school diploma. At this time, students who do not achieve adequate scores for the PARCC assessment or do not participate in the PARCC assessment will need to either meet the minimum scores for one of the alternative standardized assessments in the chart or complete an extensive portfolio review process.

Last fall, the NJDOE announced that high school juniors currently enrolled in an Advanced Placement English class may be exempt from taking the PARCC ELA 11 assessment.
