Advanced Placement Summary:

Seventy students took a total of twelve subject examinations during the spring of 2016.

Computing Class Rank:

All courses count toward class rank which is determined by grade point average. Class rank is cumulative beginning in grade 9. Grades in Honors, AP and CC courses are weighted.

Explanation of Special Courses:

- Grade 9 English and World History are team taught utilizing an interdisciplinary curriculum.
- Some courses are noted "CC", indicating concurrent enrollment with Sussex County Community College. Students will receive transferable college credits and an official transcript from the college.
- All Honors and Advanced Placement level science classes have an additional lab period. Biology, Chemistry, and Physics taken at the CP level also have a separate lab period. All other science courses have a lab included in the course period.
- Academies (admission is competitive based on grades, teacher recommendations, and an essay):
 - Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math (S.T.E.A.M.) a dynamic research-based curriculum with a heavy concentration on math and science content
 - Future Teachers Academy (F.T.A.) an intense program highlighting creative lesson planning, innovative technology, and cooperative community service
- New electives: Website Design, Introduction to CAD & Wood Sculpture, Creative Cooking & Baking, American Culture & 21st Century Learner, AP Studio Art.

Honor Roll:

The high school honor roll is based on the grade point average a student earns during each marking period. Two levels of honors are recognized on the basis of grade point average.

- High Honor Roll Marking Period GPA of 3.7000 or greater
- Honor Roll Marking Period GPA of 3.300 through 3.6999

In order to be eligible to receive honor roll recognition a student must carry a minimum of thirty credits. The following grade designations are "place holders" and are not included in Honor Roll calculations: Withdrew Passing (WP), Withdrew Failing (WF), Pass (P), and Incomplete (I). Loss of credit due to absences ("Z" grades) exclude students from Honor Roll.

Grade point averages are figured for all students in the class at the end of each school year (9th - 12th). All Honors, Advanced Placement, and College Credit courses are weighted equally.
