Over the past five years, our district has experienced a cumulative reduction in state aid totaling \$8.4 million due to the implementation of S-2. Despite these reductions, the District has made every effort to increase the local tax levy while maintaining fiscal responsibility, ensuring that budgetary decisions prioritize student needs and instructional quality. However, the loss of state aid has necessitated difficult cuts to essential programs and services, which the District now seeks to restore with the requested expenditure increase. Additionally, according to state figures, our district will enter the 2025-2026 budget year \$4 million under adequacy. These investments are crucial for maintaining compliance with the educational standards set forth by the State of New Jersey. Without these resources, our ability to provide students with a thorough and efficient education, as mandated by law, would be significantly compromised.

Therefore, the Hopatcong Board of Education is approving the submission of this application to the Commissioner of Education.
