Board of Education President Visits “Chiefs Morning News”

Last week, Hopatcong Board of Education President, Anthony Fasano, visited Hopatcong High School’s “Chiefs Morning News” to give a special welcome back address to Hopatcong High School students.



Fasano started his address by introducing himself as not only the Board president, but as proud graduate from Hopatcong’s Class of 2012. “Hopatcong is quickly becoming a leader in public education with more opportunities for students than ever before” he said as he highlighted the Board’s investments in modernizing curriculum and policies, new courses based on student interest, new extracurricular activities, new equipment, new student resources and many new relationships the district has formed with academic institutions and charitable organizations over the last few years. He stated to the students that the Board’s reasoning for these investments in student achievement was done for a simple reason: “We believe in you.”

“Chiefs Morning News” is the flagship program of Hopatcong’s Arrow TV which is produced by the students of Hopatcong High School’s Television/Video Production Class. Every morning it is broadcasted live to all Hopatcong High School students as it covers building announcements, weather reports, local and national news and even what is for lunch in the café. The daily program can also be viewed online and is accessible to the public.

Toward the end of his address, Fasano gave some advice to the high school students stating “Regardless of if you’re a freshman who is just getting started or a senior who is preparing for the next step in your life, I encourage you to take advantage of the opportunities you have at Hopatcong High School. The friendships that you make, the experiences that you have and the amazing staff members you meet will all have a lasting impact on your life, as I’ve learned that lesson myself here.” At the end of his address, Fasano reminded the students that the Hopatcong School District, and the community at large “will support you and is always here for you.”
