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### \*Note: When considering voice:

  - 1st person narrator vs. 2nd person narrator vs. 3rd person narrator
  - word-choice
  - syntax: sentence length and sentence variation
  - diction: formal vs. informal punctuation
  - dialogue
  - slang, cliché, dialect....or....lack of slang, cliché, dialect
